## Code of Conduct

### Parent/Guardian

As a South Auckland Rangers Football Club member and/or participant, you should meet the following requirements with regard to your conduct during any South Auckland sanctioned activity:

- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of others.
- Be fair, considerate and honest in all dealings with others.
- Be professional in, and accept responsibility for your actions.
- Be aware of, and maintain, an uncompromising adherence to standards, rules, regulations and policies.
- Operate within the Constitution, Regulations, Policies and Procedures of NZF and FIFA.
- Refrain from any form of abuse towards others, which includes using foul language and all forms of discrimination towards others.
- Refrain from any form of victimisation towards others.
- Reject corruption, drugs, racism, violence and other dangers to our sport.
- Promote the interest of football.
- Show concern and caution towards others who may be sick or injured.
- Be a positive role model.
- Do not speak to any media in a negative way, or publish any negative comment (including on any website) regarding South Auckland Rangers Football Club.
- Do not participate (or benefit from assisting others involved) in sports betting or gambling activity associated with football matches and/or football results in which you are participating or have been directly involved in.



**A Parent/Guardian will:**

- Agree to abide by the Code of Conduct.
- Remember that children participate in sport for their enjoyment, not the parents. Encourage children to participate and not force them.
- Focus on the child's efforts and performance. Encourage children always to compete according to the rules and to settle disagreements without resorting to hostility or violence.
- Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake or losing a competition. Remember that children learn best by example.
- Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from sporting activities.
- Respect officials' decisions and teach children to do likewise.
- Show appreciation for coaches, officials and administrators.
